YOUR BRIEF BIOGRAPHY (250-300 words):

Alastair McBain is a graduate of Oxford University and has over 38 years' experience in the oil industry. He spent the first 17 years of his career with Shell in numerous senior international postings including assignments in Singapore, Dubai, China and Venezuela. Prior to leaving Shell, he worked in their natural gas business with specific responsibility for the development of LNG projects. He joined the Vitol group in 1995 to head up the growth of the group's portfolio of upstream assets and became CEO of Arawak Energy in September 2002. Arawak was listed in Toronto and was admitted to the LSE in July 2008 before being privatized in 2009, becoming a wholly owned subsidiary of the Vitol Group, the world's largest independent energy trading company. Arawak acquired its initial stake in Geo-Alliance, a leading independent Ukrainian oil and gas group in August 2012, where Alastair serves as Chairman of the Board. In addition to Ukraine, Arawak and the Vitol Group explore for, develop and produce oil and gas from blocks in Azerbaijan and Mexico. Current equity production is over 7,000 boe/d.



ANSWER THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS:

Why do you think membership in the American Chamber of Commerce is important for business operating in Ukraine?

The Chamber provides a forum for discussion of issues facing the industry and at the same time is a platform for dialogue with the government at a higher level than normally achievable by companies acting individually.
