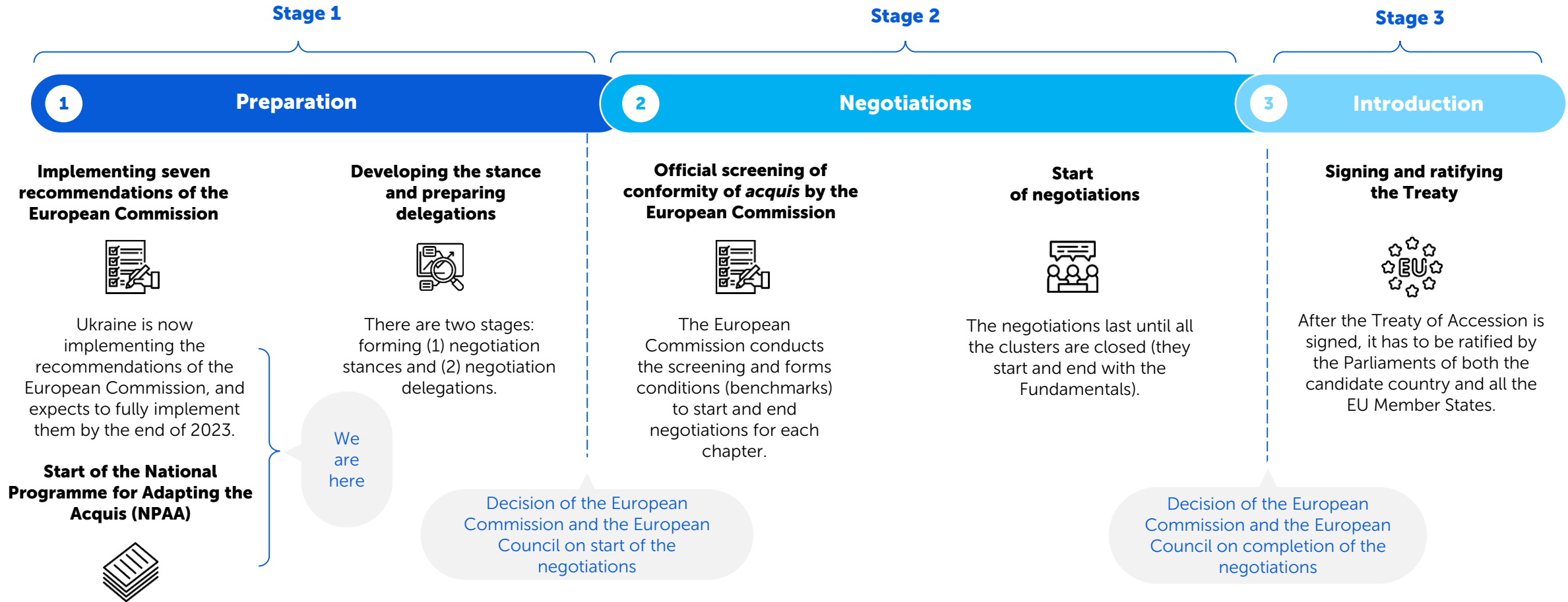

*EU *acquis* (which means 'that which has been acquired or obtained' in French) means an aggregate of legislative acts, political documents and practical application thereof.

SELF-SCREENING STAGES

6 months — duration of the self-screening process

28.02 – 14.03.2023

Preparation and organisation stage of the self-screening (two weeks)

15.03 - 30.06.2023

Stage I of the self-screening — filling in electronic tables for 34 negotiation chapters (three months and a half)

01.07 – 30.08.2023

Stage II of the self-screening — preparing reports based on the self-screening results (two months)

NUMBERS

more than **80** public authorities and state institutions involved into the self-screening

34 chapters (six clusters)

~28,000 total number of acts processed

~3,000 acts to be implemented in the Ukrainian legislation

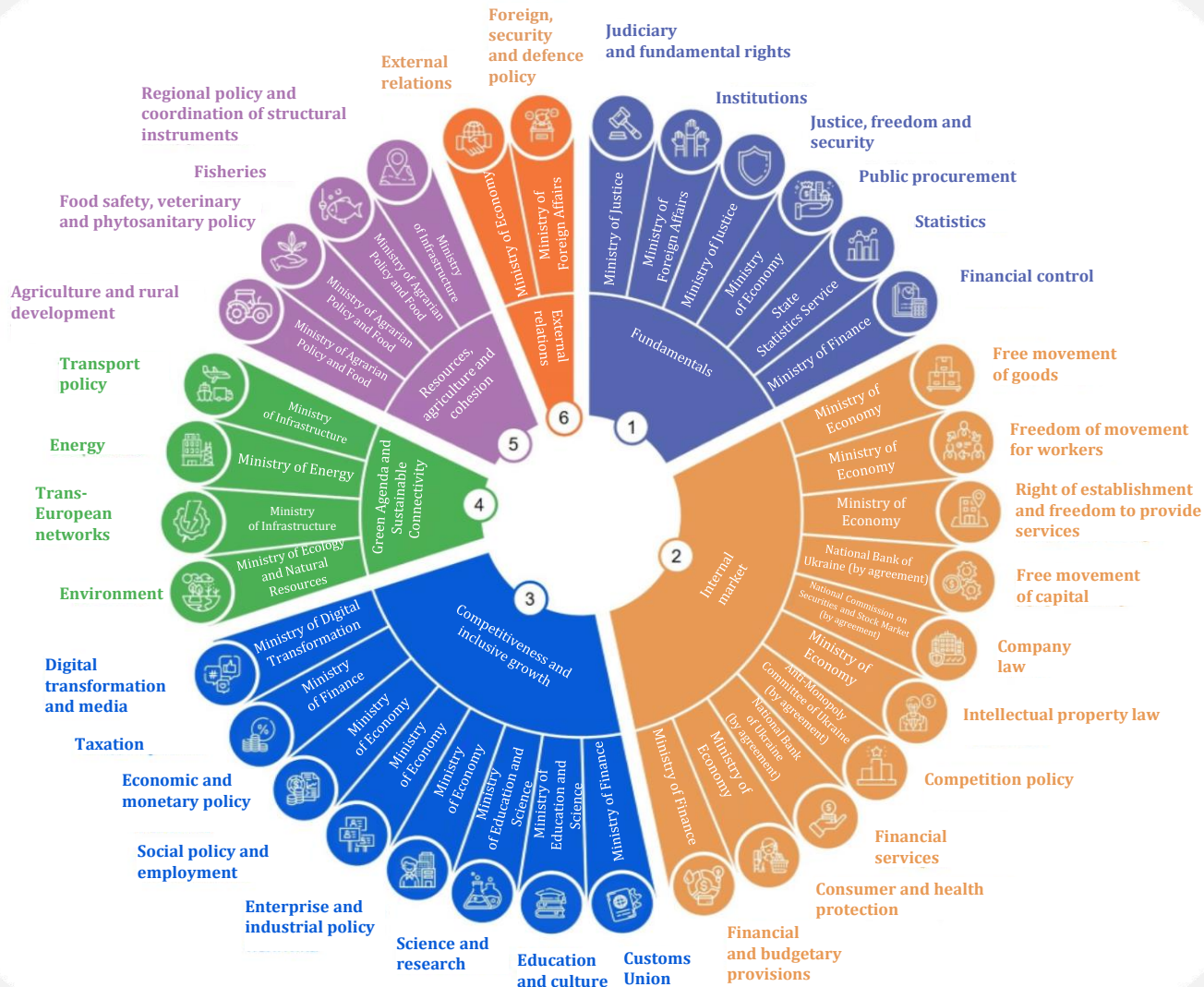

NEGOTIATION CHAPTERS AND CLUSTERS UNDER THE NEGOTIATION PROCESS REGARDING THE EU MEMBERSHIP



34 total number of negotiation chapters

6 total number of clusters

All the acts are divided by **34 negotiation chapters and fields.**

The largest number of acts can be found in the following chapters:

over 5,000 acts

30. External relations

over 2,500 acts

12. Food safety, veterinary and phytosanitary policy

~ 2,500 acts

28. Consumer and health protection

~ 2,000 acts

8. Competition policy

over 1,500 acts

14. Transport policy

Out of **~3,000 acts**, **around 250 are to be implemented** within the Fundamentals Cluster, which is the first to open and the last to close.

NEXT STEPS

- 1 Forming the relevant acquis list
- 2 Consolidated list of the Ukrainian legislation that has already been adopted and is consistent with acquis
- 3 Analysing the differences between the acquis implementation progress within the AA and EU acquis
- 4 Developing the National Programme for Adapting the Legislation to the EU Acquis and the Acquis Implementation Plan (to replace the AA AP)
- 5 Drafting the legal and normative acts to be adopted within the negotiation process
- 6 Adopting relevant draft laws
- 7 Implementing the legislation adopted
- 8 Monitoring consistency of the draft laws with the European commitments
- 9 Processing approaches to formation of negotiation stances
- 10 Supporting the European Commission in preparation for the official screening in 2024
